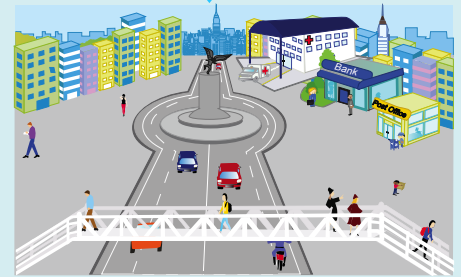

# community

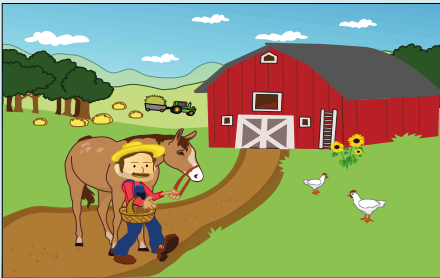

A community can be a **neighborhood**, a **village**, a town or a **city**.



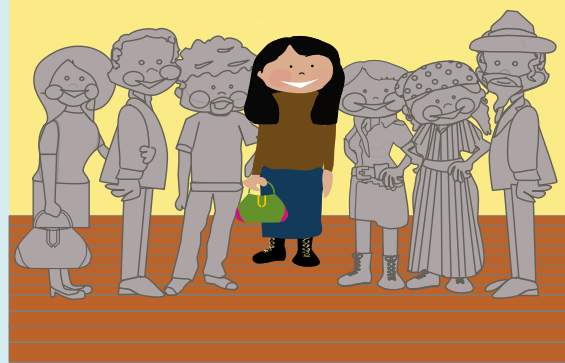
A neighborhood can be **rural**, **suburban** or **urban**.
